Most of the content of this CD-ROM is formatted using Adobe's Portable Document Format (PDF). To read these pages, you will need Adobe's Acrobat Reader plug-in or helper application. Although most computers have this software already, we have provided Acrobat Reader installers for both Microsoft Windows and Apple Macintosh operating systems, located in the INSTALL folder. Please refer to the README.TXT file in that folder for instructions.

Insert the *Handbook* CD-ROM into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Following standard procedures for your operating system, open the HOME.HTM file on the CD-ROM in your Java-compatible browser.
